Chapter 1 Discussion

Picture a soldier standing watch over Jesus' tomb that Friday night, silently pondering all the things he had witnessed at Golgotha.

- 1. How might the soldier have answered the question "Who was—Who *is* this man?"
- 2. If the same soldier stood guard again on Saturday night and Sunday morning, how do you think he would have answered the same question Sunday afternoon?
- 3. Has God ever used a display of awesome power or extraordinary tenderness or forgiveness to get your attention? How did that experience affect your thinking? Did it change your behavior?
- 4. What hard-hearted ways do you have now? What do you think it would take to shake you into changing?

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Chapter 2 Discussion

- 1. Followers of Jesus still come under attack from his enemies. What examples have you seen in the news or your own experience?
- 2. What can we learn from Jesus' disciples about how best to act in the face of persecution?
- 3. Have you, like Judas Iscariot and Simon Peter, done or said something that caused serious harm to someone else? To someone you loved?
- 4. Did that person forgive you? Have you forgiven yourself? Do you know, as Peter knew, that there is hope for forgiveness in Jesus?
- 5. Have you, like John, ever put your faith in a dream that you were sure was God's plan, only to have your expectations crushed? Did you begin to question your faith? Or God's faithfulness?

	treated that way make you feel?


2. Think about the spectators at Calvary who had previously cheered for Jesus and witnessed his miracles. What reasons might they give for keeping silent? For joining in the mockery?

- 2. Have you ever felt as if God abandoned you when your mission ran into difficulties?
- 3. Has a psalm or other scripture verse or a familiar hymn ever strengthened or comforted you by expressing exactly what you're going through?
- 4. Our closing song is "God Be with You till We Meet Again." What do you think is the significance of asking God to "be with" a person?

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
